## The Threat

Murieston Village Hall is at threat from proposed Council cuts. West Lothian Council have given us 3 choices:

- Transfer of ownership under Community Asset Transfer
- Full Repair and Insuring lease agreement
- Recharge to Management Committees

## Opportunity or Acceptance of Fate?

Murieston Community Development Trust and Murieston Initiative SCIO (the charity which runs the hall) are working in partnership to try to save the hall but we desperately need help if it is to survive.

We had a plan but it would take 10 years and the Council are only giving us 18 months. None of the current options stack up financially. Do we try to save it or do we give up now? It depends on how much you are willing to help.
